In Graeco-Roman era, along the Tyrrhenian coast between Milazzo and Capo Peloro, there was the “Nauloco”, an important commercial port become famous because of the battle between Sesto Pompeo and Ottaviano’s fleet, to whom later it was conferred the title of Augusto and first Emperor of Rome.

<b>Maceration</b>	30 days on grape skins in Terracotta Amphora with frequent pumping over

### ORGANOLEPTIC FEATURES

<b>Color</b>	Golden yellow
<b>Bouquet</b>	Dried fruit and citrus smells. The wine is dry on the palate, with a pleasant finale.
